Map and Directions to Pfeffer Scout Reservation



The Pfeffer Scout Reservation is home to Camp Roy C. Manchester is located near Benton, Kentucky. (see map above). Directions: Take Interstate 65 South from Louisville to Exit 91. Follow signs for Western Kentucky Parkway, take Parkway for approx. 100 miles until it becomes I-69. Take Exit 1B for I-24W which will merge to become I-24W/I-69S. Take Exit 25A, for the Purchase Parkway toward Fulton. At Exit 47, you will take US-68 toward Draffenville and Aurora. Turn left on US 68-E and then left on Cross Road. The Camp will be at the end of the road.

From Nashville take I-24W toward Kentucky. Then take Exit 65 for US 68/80. Turn left on US68/80. After 25 miles, turn right on US-68 W. After six miles, turn right on Cross Road. The Camp will be at the end of the road.

Activity and Fee Schedule

Cub Scout Events will include Scout Skills, First Aid Skills, boat making and Raingutter Regatta, Festival Games, BB shooting, archery, a fishing program with Fish and Wildlife service, displays with Pennyrile Electric, and nature displays and boating.

Boy Scout Events will include leatherwork projects, Mammal Study merit badge, flag folding/knot/and fire relays, Low C.O.P.E and climbing wall, Rifle and Shotgun Shooting, and tours of Aquabase, as well as boating.

Upon arrival each Unit will receive a rotational schedule with all these events.

We also encourage each Unit to camp at Pfeffer Scout Reservation. Please plan to camp as a Unit.

How do we Register? Please complete the Registration Form on the back of the Leaders Guide or register on-line at www.lhcsa.org. Event cost covers an event patch, all activities, and lunch on Saturday.

What is the Cost?

\$10.00 per camper (youth or adult) before 4-13-2018

\$15.00 per camper (youth or adult) after 4-13-2018

\$7.00 per day visitor (youth or adult) before 4-13-2018

\$10.00 per day visitor (youth or adult) after 4-13-2018

Refund Policy:

A refund will be made to an individual or group that cancels program attendance/registration, less a 15% administrative charge as long as a written request is made at least 30 days prior to a council or district program/activity.

No refunds will be given to an individual or group that cancels program attendance/registration within 30 days of a scheduled council or district program/activity. Exceptions for medical situations or family emergencies can be made, but must be submitted in writing within 7 days after the program/activity.

No refund request will be accepted after 7 days of the activity.

All requests for refunds must be submitted in writing with a copy of the receipt or cancelled check.

Unit Preparation for Pfeffer Pfest

If your unit follows the steps listed below, the process of preparing everyone for an enjoyable experience at Pfeffer Scout Reservation should go smoothly.

Upon Receiving the Leaders Guide

- Inform or remind all Scouts and parents of the Camp Dates.
- Recruit two or more adult leaders to spend the weekend with your unit.
- Note payment dates to ensure your troop gets the early bird discounts.
- Make arrangements for physicals to be done if they are not current. Finalizing plans for the outing:
- Give final notice to all Scouts and parents about plans for attending camp.
- See that all Scouts and Adults have a current medical form.
- Arrange for your transportation to and from camp.
- Insure all your Scouts families have the information for this weekend.
- Register online at www.lhcbasa.org or send registration form and fees to the Scout Service Center.

One week before Camp

- Review Schedule with your Scouts and families.
- Duty Roster for the weekend.
- Confirm unit menu.
- Insure all fees are paid.
- Prepare the unit/patrol equipment to bring to camp.
- Inspect each Scouts personal gear.
- Finalize Transportation arrangements to and from camp.

Arrival and Check-In:

- You can start arriving Friday, April 27, 2017, at 5:00pm.
- Please check-in at the Administration Building upon arrival with a headcount and fees.

Policies and Procedures

Anyone participating in or attending this event will be expected to follow BSA National Guidelines as outlined in the Guide to Safe Scouting.

The Law is the Rule: Everyone is expected to abide by the Boy Scout Oath and Law and the Cub Scout Motto: *Do Your Best*. Everyone must stay away from UNAUTHORIZED AREAS during the event.

Buddy System: Everyone must use the Buddy System, pairs for safety. Unit Leaders or other adults should be notified before scouts leave their campsites.

Alcoholic Beverages: Possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages will not be tolerated, as it is against BSA policy. Possession or consumption of alcohol is grounds for immediate dismissal from the event.

Smoking: BSA guidelines require a smoke-free environment for our Scouts. If you must smoke, please do so out of sight of youth participants and not inside any buildings. Please “field dress” your butts and dispose of them properly, remembering the ever present danger of wild fires.

Vehicles: No vehicles will be allowed in camp except to drop gear or a trailer at your campsite. If your unit does not have or use a trailer, you may have one gear vehicle per unit. The speed on the camp entrance road is 15 MPH. Vehicles delivering trailers and/or gear, please observe an 3 MPH limit. RVs, ATVs, and bicycles are NOT allowed on camp. Only Staff vehicles and staff carts are permitted in the main camp area after 9:30 PM on Friday evening. All other vehicles must be moved to designated parking areas by that time.

Parking: Park in designated parking areas only. Unit leaders need to help enforce this policy. We need to preserve Pfeffer Scout Reservation as much as possible. The primary parking area is inside the gravel parking lot at the base of the camp road.

Uniforms: Activity uniforms (also known as “Class B” uniforms, unit t-shirts, or other Scouting appropriate attire) are permitted during the opening ceremonies and activity rotations.

First Aid: You should have your own first aid kit in your campsite. Minor first aid should be handled at the Campsite. Medical Emergencies should be directed through Headquarters at the Administration Building.

Campsites: Follow BSA guidelines for camping. Walk, do not run, within your campsite. Remember to be aware of tent stakes and tie downs. Do not ditch or trench your tent. Closed toed shoes must be worn at all times. Leave no Trace. Trash your trash. It should be removed from all campsites.

Absolutely NO pets. Please make certain before leaving on Sunday that your campsite is completely cleaned up and all campfires are completely extinguished. Campsites will be assigned by camp staff prior to your arrival. It is unlikely that any Pack will have a campsite completely to themselves. *Make a new friend.*

Stoves and Lanterns: Follow BSA regulations for fuels. Keep open flames out of and at least 10 feet away from tents.

Campfires: All campfires in all campsites must be under the supervision of an adult. Do not cut trees. Bring your own firewood or collect dead wood from downed trees and limbs. No pit/trench fires are allowed; use on the fire rings provided or bring your own above ground fire bowl. Never leave a campfire unattended, especially when going to bed. All campfires should be extinguished according to BSA guidelines – cold to the touch. Please make certain before leaving on Sunday that your campsite is completely cleaned up and all campfires are completely extinguished.

Chainsaws: No chainsaws are permitted.

Knives, Hatchets, Axes, and Saws: Folding or pocket knives are permitted by those Scouts that have earned their Whittlin' Chip. No fixed blade, sheath or survival knives are permitted. Hatchets, axes and bow saws are only permitted in the axe yards of Boy Scout Troops or Venturing Crews.

Firearms: No firearms are permitted at Camp during this event except the BB guns that are under the supervision of BSA-trained BB Gun Rangemasters.

Rocks and Sticks: Although tempting, rocks must not be thrown or kicked and sticks must not be swung. Injury/damage to property usually results from this action. Such actions will result in your being asked to leave the event immediately.

Trash: Each Unit will be issued several trash bags and will be responsible for keeping their own campsite area clean. The Dumpster is located in the parking lot. No trash should remain in campsites over night; there are a variety of critters (skunks, raccoons, opossums, etc) that will visit your unit if this is not done.

Cleanup: When your Unit is ready to leave camp we ask that you please clean up your campsite area and leave it the same as you found it, or better. Please take your trash to the dumpster (or home with you).
