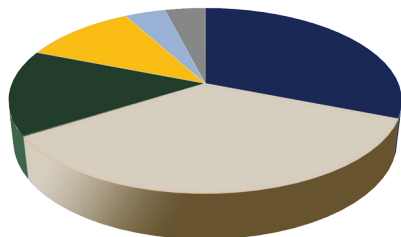
Vision Statement

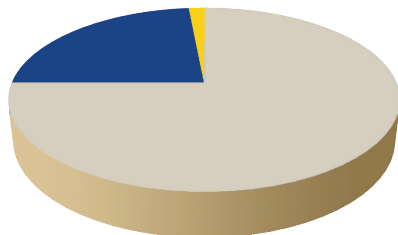
