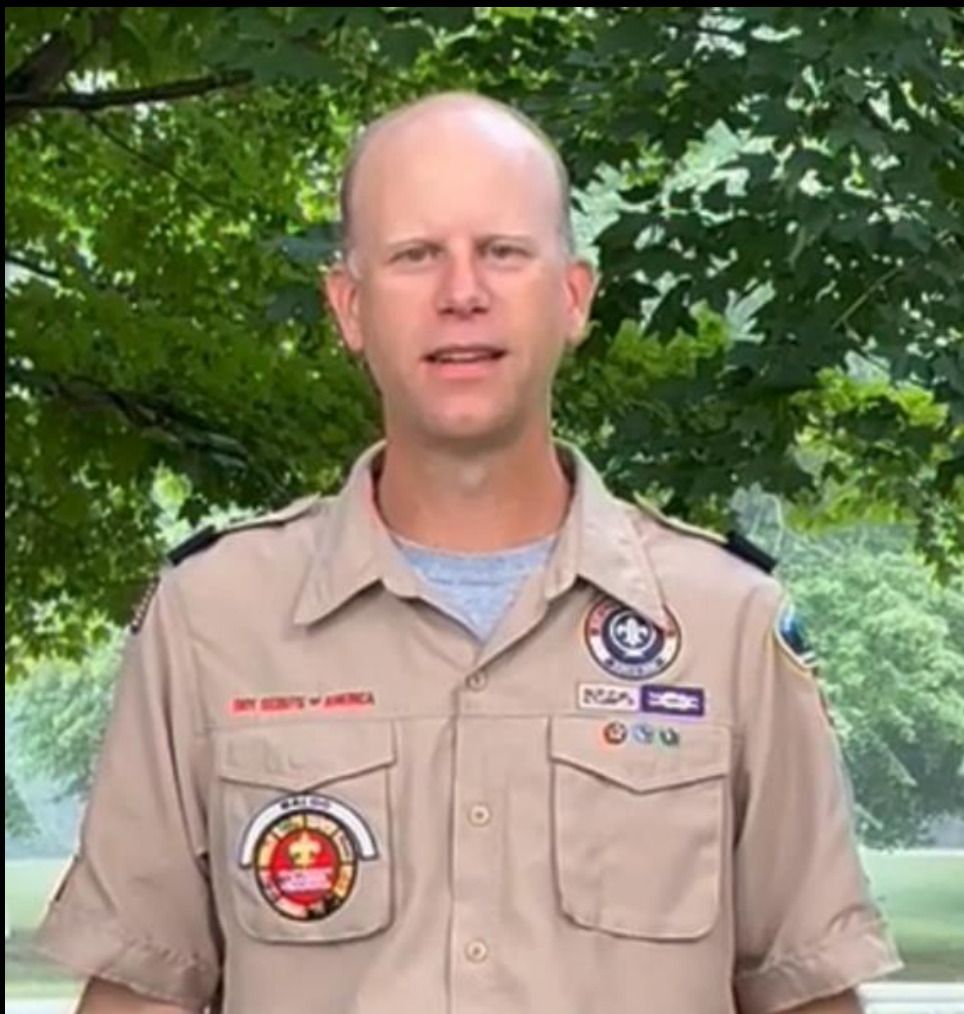

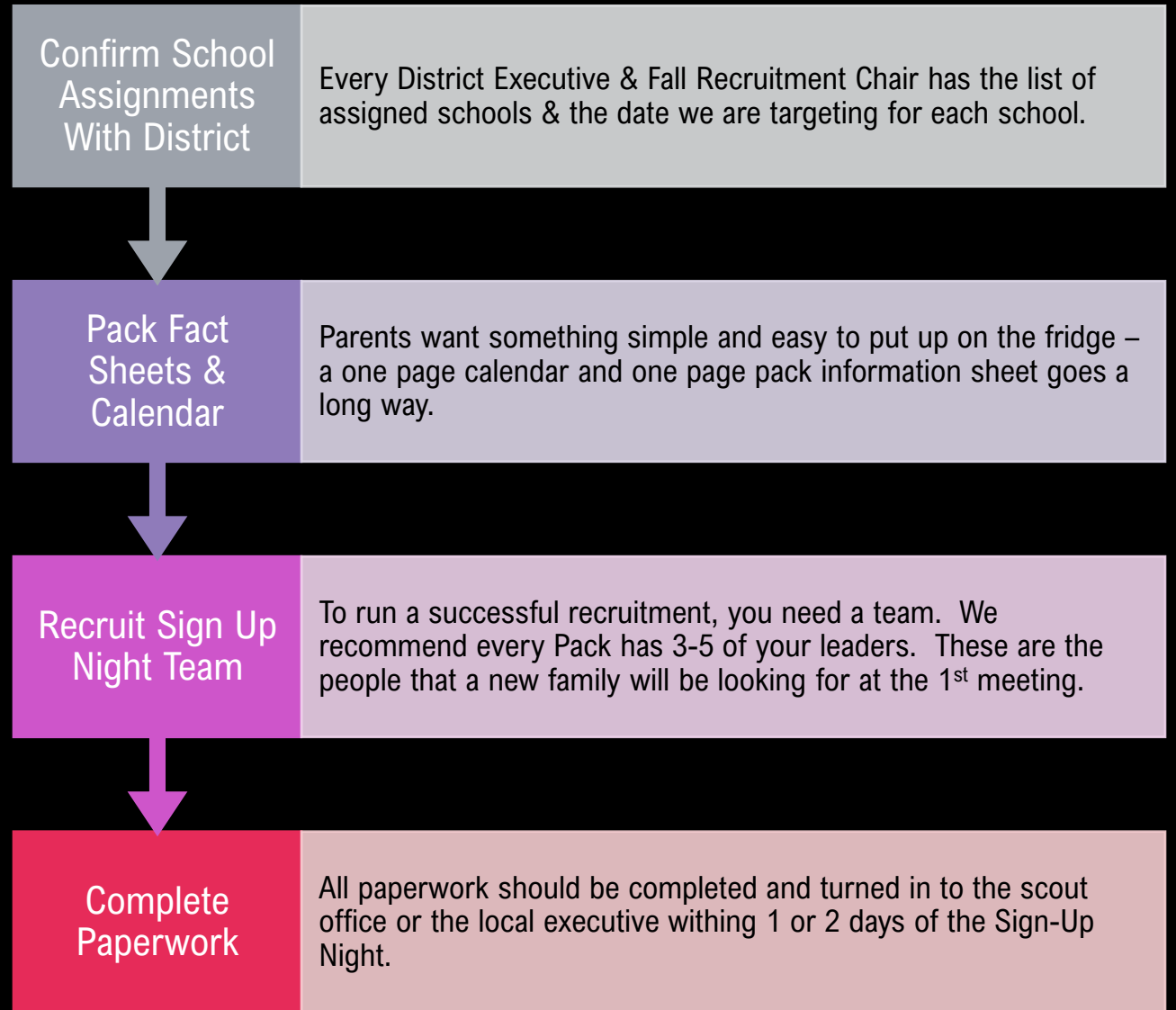

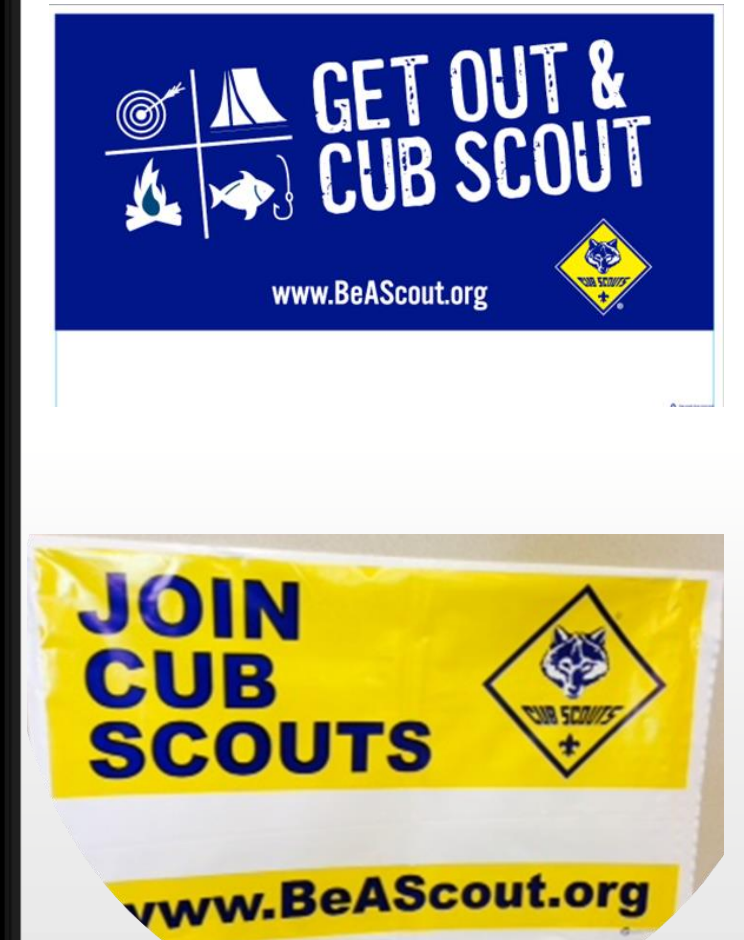

What is Cub Scouting?

Cub Scouting is a year-round, family-oriented program for boys and girls in kindergarten through 5th grade. In adults, Cub Scouting is all about developing character, citizenship, and physical fitness awareness. To youth, Cub Scouting is all about FUN!

The Scout Motto: Be a Good Two Dots

Cub Scouting offers youth:

A fun and safe environment to learn and grow while pursuing a broad array of interests.

- Character development centered around good deeds and values.
- The chance to learn life skills that will help children become successful adults and a contributing member of society.
- Exciting outdoor experiences like hiking, camping, swimming, fishing, and more.
- Badges that reward achievement and goal learning and growth.

Best of all, as a parent, grandparent, or other adult partner, you get to participate. Rather than end your bond on the sidelines, you can be part of the action as you share time quality time and first lasting memories with your son or daughter.

The Cub Scouting Program

The Cub Scout Pack
A Cub Scout pack is composed of youth in grades kindergarten through 5th grade. The youth in a pack come from local schools, neighborhoods, churches, and the community. Every pack is sponsored by a "chartered organization." Packs usually meet once a month and hold special events throughout the year. A Cub Scout pack is led by the Cubmaster who works with the den leaders, pack committee, and parents.

The Cub Scout Den

Cub Scout dens are individual groups within the pack formed by age. Your child will spend most of their time working with kids the same age and their parents. Each age group is represented by an animal or insect. Dens of 6-10 youth and meet once or twice a month. The leader who is in charge of the den is called the den leader.

Pack Organization & Volunteer Leadership

Chartered Organization
This is the organization that partners with the Boy Scouts of America to deliver a Scouting program. They adopt Scouting to serve the needs in the community.

Chartered Organization Representative

This person appoints the pack committee chair and approves all adult leaders. They provide resources from the chartering organization.

Pack Committee Chair

The top volunteer in the pack is the pack committee chair. They are responsible for ensuring enough qualified adult volunteers are in place to provide the program. They also lead the pack committee meetings.

Cubmaster

The leader of the pack scouting is the Cubmaster. In addition to serving as the leader of ceremonies, the Cubmaster provides support to den leaders.

Pack Committee

The pack committee is made up of parents, leaders, and other caring adults that work to support den leaders and the Cubmaster.

Den Leaders

An adult, usually a parent, serves as a den leader. They carry out the activities related to adventures as they are presented in the Cub Scout handbook and the den leader guide.

The Scout Motto: Be Prepared

Unit Fundraising

Fundraising helps Scouts purchase gear to support their Scouting program for the entire year! These fundraisers are used to cover the cost of equipment, gear, camp fees, equipment, summer camp and more. The two main fundraisers are:

Popcorn Sale: Taking place every Fall, Scouts sell delicious popcorn to their family and friends to help raise money.

Camp Cards: Camp Cards are designed to help Scouts earn their way to camp. Each card represents a different activity that can be approved by the pack committee.

Year-round Adventures & Fun

Cub Scout Fun Days Challenge: Organized by local districts, Cub Scout Fun Days let Scouts enjoy modern, BB guns, archery, water, obstacle courses, and STEM activities in local parks and nearby Scout camps.

Den Camping Trips (week-ends): Starting in a tent overnight with their family is a big adventure for any Cub Scout. Every setting is a chance to explore a new area, exploring the natural world, your Cub Scout will learn concepts that will last a lifetime while spending quality time with their family.

Halloween (October): Being one day of fun and games and a day of spooky (not scary!) Halloween fun. Activities include BB gun, archery, bow and arrow, pumpkin painting, Halloween games, and candy trails. Camp overnight if you dare!

Meeting the Food (November): This annual food drive benefits and provides to your community. Cub Scouts distribute door hangers on Saturday and collect food the following Saturday. In doing so, they begin learning the joy of helping others and prepare for even more service in the future.

Pinewood Derby (January - March): The pinewood derby is an annual Scouting event. Scouts build their own cars from blocks of wood and race at their own pack pinewood derby before competing for the entire pinewood derby event!

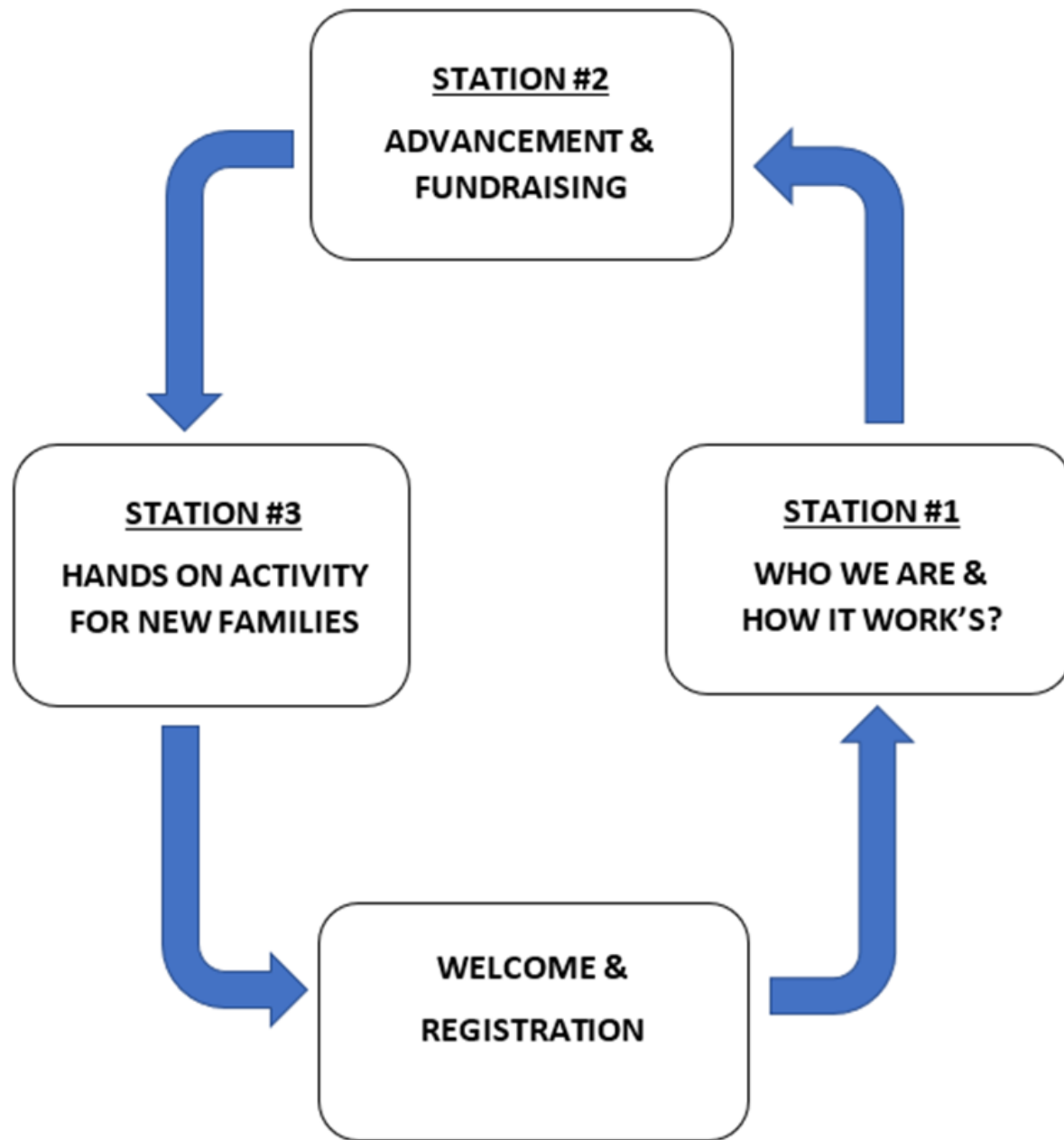
