How much time does this involve?

Who are the leaders?

Leaders are parents just like you and community minded individuals who volunteer their time for the benefit of young people. All adult volunteers must fill out an adult application, go through a background check, and take Youth Protection training.

How can I become an adult volunteer?

There are many roles to be filled in each Troop, and every parent willing to help is always appreciated. Ask your Troop leaders about where they could use a hand.

How much does it cost?

There is a fee for the annual registration (\$24), handbook (\$10), and an optional Boy's Life Magazine (\$12). Troops can participate in fundraisers throughout the year to support additional activities. Every Troop is different and may have additional annual dues. Fees will be discussed at the sign up meeting.
