-  Encourage your Scout to live the Scout Oath & Law every day

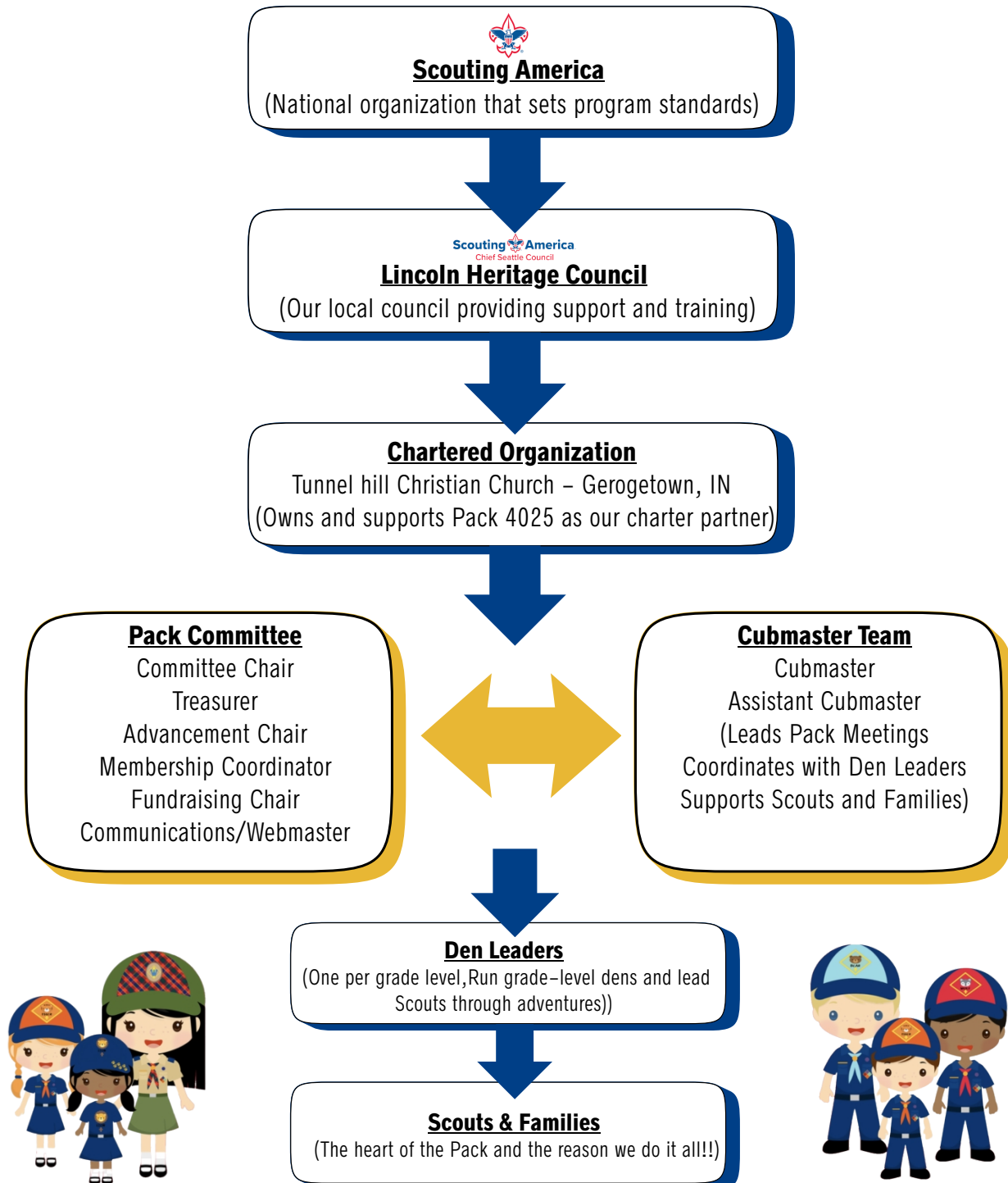

GETTING STARTED WITH PACK 4025

YOUR FIRST STEPS IN THE ADVENTURE

Welcome to the adventure! These simple steps will help your family get started in Cub Scouting with Pack 4025, from registration to your first meeting. You can complete most of them at or right after your first Pack Night.

1. Register Your Scout

Complete youth registration online at BeAScout.org or with a paper application from our Membership Coordinator.

2. Pay Pack Dues

Dues cover badges, supplies, and Pack activities. Ask our Treasurer for current rates and payment options.

3. Get the Uniform & Handbook

Visit the Louisville Scout Shop or scoutshop.org to purchase your Cub Scout uniform and handbook. (See the next page for details.)

4. Join Scoutbook Plus

After your registration is processed, you'll receive an invitation to Scoutbook Plus our official communication and advancement tracking system.

5. Mark Your Calendar

Add Pack Meetings, campouts, and major events from our Facebook Group at <https://www.facebook.com/groups/1323485261914720>.

6. Meet Your Den Leader & Pack Team

Attend your first Den Meeting and Pack Night to get connected, ask questions, and learn how your family can participate.

7. Jump In & Have Fun!

Every family is part of the adventure; join activities, lend a hand, and enjoy learning together!

Pro Tips for New Families

- ★ Attend your first Pack Meeting, you'll meet leaders and other families.
- ★ Keep your Scout's uniform and handbook in a spot for easy access.
- ★ Log into Scoutbook Plus often, it tracks achievements and event details.
- ★ Ask questions! Every leader remembers being new too.





LOOKING SHARP IN YOUR UNIFORM

The Cub Scout uniform is a proud symbol of belonging, responsibility, and achievement. Wearing the uniform builds unity, reminds Scouts to live by the Scout Oath and Law, and makes our Pack feel like a team.

Each rank level has its own uniform and handbook. Here's what your Scout will need to get started.

Bear	Navy Scout shirt Light Blue Neckerchief	Bear Ball Cap
Webelos	Navy Scout shirt Plaid Neckerchief	Webelos Plaid Ball Cap
Arrow of Light (AOL)	Tan Scout shirt Plaid/Den created Neckerchief	Webelos Plaid Ball Cap or Green Scout Ball Cap

Patch Placement

Use the patch placement guide in the Cub Scout Handbook or check out ScoutShop.org.

Uniform Tips

- Write your Scout's name on uniform tags, shirts travel between dens!
- Ask leaders for help with badge placement.
- "Class B" Pack T-shirts are great for campouts and outdoor events.
- Bring your handbook to every meeting, it's your adventure guide!



Uniform Notes

- The blue Cub Scout shirt is worn from Tiger through Webelos.
- The tan Scout shirt carries into Scouts BSA after Arrow of Light.
- Neckerchiefs and slides change with each rank.
- Pants, belts, and socks are optional but encouraged for formal events.
- All uniform items are available at the Louisville Scout Shop or online at ScoutShop.org

Our Commitment to Youth Protection

Scouting America's **S.A.F.E. Framework** ensures every activity is conducted safely and responsibly.

Every registered adult and volunteer completes **Youth Protection Training (YPT)** and background checks before working with Scouts.

S.A.F.E. = Supervision, Assessment, Fitness & Skill, Equipment & Environment

S – Supervision | At least two registered adults are present at all times.

A – Assessment | Activities are reviewed for age-appropriate planning and risks.

F – Fitness & Skill | Leaders ensure activities match participants' abilities.

E – Equipment & Environment | Safety gear, weather, and site conditions are always checked.

Required Training

All adults connected to Pack 4025 are asked to complete Safeguarding Youth Training (SYT) online through the Scouting America Online Training found at my.scouting.org

After completion, please email your certificate to cubscoutpack4025@gmail.com so we can record it with the Pack.
